

#### WYCLIFFE BIBLE TRANSLATORS

In 1917 a missionary named William Cameron Townsend went to Guatemala to sell Spanish Bibles, but he was shocked when many people couldn't understand the books. They spoke Cakchiquel, a language without a Bible. He believed that everyone should understand the Bible so he started a linguistics' school which trained people to do Bible translation. The work continued to grow and in 1942 he officially founded Wycliffe Bible Translators.

For over 70 years Wycliffe has helped people around the world translate the Bible into their own languages. They also help with language development, other spiritual and physical needs and literacy help. After all if someone is unable to read, it's not much use having a Bible in any language.

Many people in countries all over the world still do not have a Bible in their own language - an estimated 1,800 languages are still waiting for a Bible translation to begin. It's hard to imagine, living in England and having many different versions of the Bible available to us in our very popular, widely spoken (and read) English language what it would be like to live in a country where our neighbours across the river or the other side of a mountain, spoke an entirely different language. I suppose the nearest we could try to imagine is if we could only get a Welsh language Bible available to us - how many of us would be able to read or understand it?

There are about 7,000 languages in use today and up to 180 million people need Bible translation to begin in their own language. When people do finally get a Bible in their own language, lives often change in amazing ways and people are transformed as they are led to Jesus Christ and a right relationship with God.

It is the vision and aim of Wycliffe to have started a Bible translation in every language still needing one by 2025; so there is a lot of hard work ahead. In the mountainous and densely forested country of Papua New Guinea alone there are over 800 languages spoken. Hundreds of Wycliffe Bible Translators work all

over the world from the tiny islands of the South Pacific to the large, heavily populated countries of Africa.

Whilst people around the world long to have a Bible to read, here in England we are blessed with an abundance, yet in many homes Bibles remain unopened and unused. There are such treasures contained inside these Bibles, along with guidance for the best way in which to live our lives. Maybe reading this you may be encouraged to take your Bible off the shelf and see for yourself the Good News of the Gospel contained inside it.



### Sharon's Recipe - Little Chocolate and Orange Bonnet Cakes

### **Ingredients Cake**

4oz margarine at room temperature 4oz castor sugar 2 large eggs Zest and 25ml juice of a freshly squeezed orange 4oz self-raising Flour – sieved 4oz plain or milk chocolate broken into chunks

### **Ingredients Filling**

2oz of salted butter at room temperature 4oz icing sugar 1oz cocoa powder 20 ml juice of a freshly squeezed orange Milk to mix

### **Ingredients Topping**


Icing sugar for dusting

#### Method Cake

- 1. Preheat oven to gas mark 4/180 degrees C/ 350 degrees F. Prepare a cupcake tin with paper cases
- 2. Beat together margarine and sugar until soft and fluffy in mixer is best
- 3. Add eggs very gradually beating to mix thoroughly
- 4. Add orange zest and 25 ml orange juice
- 5. Gradually blend in flour using figures of 8 movements with a metal spoon
- 6. When thoroughly mixed, put a level dessertspoon of mixture in the each paper case then place a square of chocolate in each one and then divide the remaining mixture between the paper cases to cover the chocolate
- 7. Bake for 20 minutes
- **8.** Leave to cool on wire rack

### **Method Filling**

Sift the cocoa powder and gently mix with the icing sugar. Beat butter until soft, add the icing sugar and cocoa and give it a gentle stir to start mixing. Add orange juice and mix with a wooden spoon, add a little milk then beat in the mixer until light and fluffy add more milk or more orange juice if too stiff. Using a cake corer or a sharp knife cut out a circle from the top of each cake. Fill with the filling mixture then pop the circle (bonnet) back on and press down gently. Dust with icing sugar to finish




and glue onto card to make an Easter card.
